Resolution EC 26-35

Title: Authorization to Apply for a U.S. Department of Justice Second Chance Act Youth Reentry Program Grant

WHEREAS, the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Tlingit & Haida) is a federally recognized tribe with more than 38,000 citizens; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Tlingit & Haida Constitution, the Executive Council is the governing body of Tlingit & Haida when the Tribal Assembly is not in session; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Assembly is not in session; and

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ), Office of Justice Programs (OJP), Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention (OJJDP) has announced the FY25 Second Chance Act Youth Reentry Program funding opportunity to support comprehensive reentry services that improve outcomes and reduce recidivism among youth returning to their communities following confinement; and

WHEREAS, this funding opportunity supports collaborative partnerships among Tribal governments, service providers, community organizations, and justice system partners to provide case management, educational services, behavioral health support, employment pathways, and other services that help youth successfully reintegrate into their communities; and

WHEREAS, Tlingit & Haida intends to submit an application to the DOJ for funding under the OJJDP FY25 Second Chance Act Youth Reentry Program, which may provide awards of up to \$750,000 over a 36-month period and such funding includes the full amount of Tlingit & Haida's federally approved indirect rate; and


WHEREAS, such funding would support initiatives designed to improve youth outcomes, strengthen families and communities, reduce recidivism, and expand culturally responsive support systems for youth involved in the justice system;



NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Executive Council of the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska hereby authorizes the Tlingit & Haida President, or designee, to submit, negotiate, execute, and administer any and all documents, including any subsequent amendments, that are required by the U.S. Department of Justice for granting funds to Tlingit & Haida for the proposed project.

ADOPTED this 26<sup>th</sup> day of March 2026, by the Executive Council of the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska, by a vote of 6 yeas, 0 nays, 0 abstentions and 0 absences.
