Resolution EC 26-46

Title: Authorization to Apply for National Forest Foundation Grant

WHEREAS, the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Tlingit & Haida) is a federally recognized tribe with more than 38,000 citizens; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Tlingit & Haida Constitution, the Executive Council is the governing body of Tlingit & Haida when the Tribal Assembly is not in session; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Assembly is not in session; and

WHEREAS, the National Forest Foundation has announced the availability of a conservation grant; and

WHEREAS, Tlingit & Haida is eligible to apply for grant funding to support the Alaska Youth Stewards Program; and

WHEREAS, Tlingit & Haida intends to apply for up to \$42,750 in funds from the National Forest Foundation for a one-year project, and such funding includes the full amount of Tlingit & Haida's federally approved indirect rate; and

WHEREAS, Tlingit & Haida would use these funds to support the on-the-ground stewardship projects of the Alaska Youth Stewards program in Angoon, Kake, Hoonah, Yakutat and on Prince of Wales Island; and

WHEREAS, the growth of long-term workforce development opportunities for rural and indigenous youth in Southeast Alaska, specifically, the funds will further go toward crew salary, training, and supplies for natural resource projects such as stream restoration, invasive species removal, and landslide monitoring;



NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Executive Council of the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska hereby authorizes the Tlingit & Haida President, or designee, to submit, negotiate, execute, and administer any and all documents, including any subsequent amendments, that are required by the National Forest Foundation for granting funds to Tlingit & Haida for the proposed project.


