Resolution EC 25-120

Title: Adoption of the 2025 Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan

WHEREAS, the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Tlingit & Haida) is a federally recognized tribe with more than 38,000 citizens; and

WHEREAS, under Article IV of the Tlingit & Haida Constitution, the Executive Council is the governing body of Tlingit & Haida when the Tribal Assembly is not in session; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Assembly is not in session; and

WHEREAS, Tlingit & Haida affirms that its jurisdiction and responsibility for the safety, health, and well-being of its citizens are defined by the presence of its people and the extent of its Traditional Lands—including, but not limited to, lands located within the municipal boundaries of the City and Borough of Juneau; and

WHEREAS, Tlingit & Haida recognizes the urgent and increasing risks that natural and human-caused hazards pose to its citizens, neighbors, communities, infrastructure, and cultural ways of life; and

WHEREAS, in alignment with its commitment to tribal self-governance and public safety, Tlingit & Haida has, for the first time, formally engaged in hazard mitigation planning, co-developing the City and Borough of Juneau (CBJ) and Tlingit and Haida Tribe 2025 Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan Update in partnership with the CBJ and other community stakeholders; and

WHEREAS, this plan, while serving as an update to CBJ's prior mitigation documents, marks Tlingit & Haida's first formally adopted hazard mitigation strategy focused on its Traditional Lands in and around Juneau, and is not intended to represent or encompass all lands where Tlingit & Haida holds interest or serves Tribal citizens; and

WHEREAS, the 2025 Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan outlines shared goals and specific actions aimed at reducing long-term risk to life, property, critical services, and culturally significant places across the lands where Tlingit & Haida citizens live, work, and gather in the Juneau area; and

WHEREAS, the plan aligns with federal hazard mitigation frameworks, including the Robert T. Stafford Disaster Relief and Emergency Assistance Act, the National Flood Insurance Act of 1968, and the National Dam Safety Program Act, all as amended; and

WHEREAS, adoption of this plan affirms Tlingit & Haida’s dedication to proactive emergency preparedness, long-term resilience, and responsible planning rooted in tribal sovereignty and traditional stewardship; and

WHEREAS, Tlingit & Haida affirms its intent to continue updating its all-hazards mitigation plan at each five-year planning cycle, reflecting updated risks, data, community priorities, and geographic expansion where appropriate; and

WHEREAS, portions of this plan related to Tlingit & Haida may require minor revisions during the review process, changes occurring after adoption that do not alter the intent or scope of the plan shall not require re-adoption by the Executive Council;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Executive Council of the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska hereby adopts the City and Borough of Juneau and Tlingit and Haida Tribe 2025 Multi-Jurisdictional Hazard Mitigation Plan Update as the Tribe’s foundational planning document for hazard mitigation activities within its Traditional Lands in and around Juneau.


