Resolution EC 25-134

Title: Authorization to Apply for Intertribal Agriculture Council Grant to Support Tribal Composting Program

WHEREAS, the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Tlingit & Haida) is a federally recognized tribe with more than 38,000 citizens; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Tlingit & Haida Constitution, the Executive Council is the governing body of Tlingit & Haida when the Tribal Assembly is not in session; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Assembly is not in session; and

WHEREAS, Tlingit & Haida has prioritized the development of sustainable waste reduction strategies, including a tribal composting program that diverts organic waste from disposal and creates beneficial use materials; and

WHEREAS, Tlingit & Haida intends to apply for up to \$5,000 in funds from the Intertribal Agriculture Council for a two-month project, and such funding includes the full amount of Tlingit & Haida's federally approved indirect rate; and

WHEREAS, such funds will enable this project to provide hands-on composting education, reduce food waste, and supply compost for Taay Hit Urban Farm and its greenhouse;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Executive Council of the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska hereby authorizes the Tlingit & Haida President, or designee, to submit, negotiate, execute, and administer any and all documents, including any subsequent amendments, that are required by the Intertribal Agriculture Council for granting funds to Tlingit & Haida for the composting program.

ADOPTED this 26th day of September 2025, by the Executive Council of the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska, by a vote of 5 yeas, 0 nays, 0 abstentions and 1 absence.
