Resolution EC 26-21

Title: Authorization to Apply for an Institute of Museum and Library Services Native American Basic Grant

WHEREAS, the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska (Tlingit & Haida) is a federally recognized tribe with more than 38,000 citizens; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Tlingit & Haida Constitution, the Executive Council is the governing body of Tlingit & Haida when the Tribal Assembly is not in session; and

WHEREAS, the Tribal Assembly is not in session; and

WHEREAS, the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS) has announced a Native American Basic Grant; and

WHEREAS, the IMLS goal of the program is to improve library and archival services for accessing, learning, and preserving information with the community through supporting the acquisition of library-related materials; programming for identified community priorities; training for library staff; project activities; and

WHEREAS, the IMLS will fund up to \$10,000 for tribal library programs; and

WHEREAS, Tlingit & Haida intends to apply for up to \$10,000 in funds from the IMLS for a one year project, and such funding includes the full amount of Tlingit & Haida's federally approved indirect rate; and

WHEREAS, these funds would be used for purchasing native books for community use and bookshelves;



NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Executive Council of the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska hereby authorizes the Tlingit & Haida President, or designee, to submit, negotiate, execute, and administer any and all documents, including any subsequent amendments, that are required by Institute of Museum and Library Services for granting funds to Tlingit & Haida for the proposed project.

ADOPTED this 20th day of February 2026, by the Executive Council of the Central Council of Tlingit & Haida Indian Tribes of Alaska, by a vote of 6 yeas, 0 nays, 0 abstentions and 0 absences.
