YOUR SUBSISTENCE RIGHTS ARE AT RISK

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Safari Club International has filed a Petition for Rulemaking with the U.S. Departments of the Interior and Agriculture that would restructure the Federal Subsistence Board by removing Indigenous and rural representation, limiting membership to federal agency heads, weakening rural determinations, and requiring deference to the State of Alaska.

Because Alaska cannot legally provide a rural subsistence priority, these changes could effectively eliminate the federal rural subsistence priority.

Scoping comments are being accepted, a critical early step in deciding whether and how this proposal moves forward.
